# What were the highlights and main takeaways of this conference? Highlights:

1. Keynote Speakers: Renowned experts from academia and industry presented the latest Al applications and advancements. For instance, on the first day of the main conference, the University of Oxford's Associate Professor, Alex Teytelboym, showcased an Al-driven solution designed to enhance the refugee resettlement process and optimize employment outcomes by considering refugees' preferences. At the end of his talk, he also pointed out the potential of Al in aiding refugee-related challenges. Another notable presentation came from Noam Brown of OpenAl. He introduced attendees to CICERO, a pioneering Al agent that combines a language model with advanced planning and reinforcement learning techniques. The Al agent CICERO has achieved human-level performance in an online game called Diplomacy and secured a spot in the top 10% of multi-game participants.

2. Paper Presentations: During the main conference, a diverse range of topics were covered, from foundational AI research to applied AI in various domains like healthcare (e.g., Towards Gender Fairness for Mental Health Prediction, Keeping People Active and Healthy at Home Using a Reinforcement Learning-based Fitness Recommendation Framework), agriculture (Optimizing Crop Management with Reinforcement Learning and Imitation Learning, Customized Positional Encoding to Combine Static and Time-varying Data in Robust Representation Learning for Crop Yield Prediction), and networking (Full Scaling Automation for Sustainable Development of Green Data Centers, Enhancing Network by Reinforcement Learning and Neural Confined Local Search).

3. Networking: The conference facilitated numerous networking opportunities, allowing attendees to connect with peers, potential collaborators, and industry leaders. During the conference, I have met researchers Feifei Zhao from Institute of Automation Chinese Academy of Sciences and Min Cao from the University of Suzhou. I also had discussion with potential industry collaborators Julian Dolby from IBM, Shen Ren from Continental Automotive.

#### Main Takeaways:

1. Interdisciplinary Collaboration: The future of AI requires collaboration between various disciplines, from neuroscience to sociology.

2. Al in Real-world Applications: There's a shift from theoretical research to practical applications, with a focus on how Al can solve real-world problems.
