Election of President

Total Valid Votes 143

After the tallying of all preferences, the successful candidate is Stephen JUDD.

The unsuccessful candidates were Karaitiana TAIURU and Brenda WALLACE.

Election of Vice-President

Total Valid Votes 139

Total Invalid Votes 0

Winning Threshold/Quota 70

After the tallying of all preferences, the successful candidate is Anjum RAHMAN.

The unsuccessful candidate is Kris DEMPSTER-RIVETT

Election of ONE (1) Councillor

Total Valid Votes 144

Total Invalid Votes 0

Winning Threshold/Quota 73

After the tallying of all preferences, the successful candidate is Richard HULSE.

The unsuccessful candidates were Kris DEMPSTER-RIVETT, Toa GREENING and Daniel SPECTOR.

The return percentage was 44.86% being 144 votes received from 321 members.

Report of Factual Findings

Purpose of this Agreed-Upon Procedures Report
