Project title *

Digital Inclusion for Māori and Non-Māori Seniors: Building digital capabilities for seniors with cognitive impairment.

Provide a short summary of the work that was completed as part of this project / research. *

The project followed a stepped approach 1) co design/proof of concept development approach. Focus groups were held with both Māori and non-Māori key stakeholders; older people with dementia and their care partners, older people in general, aged care providers, community NGO's alongside library staff and University staff co design the overall project. 2) Two face to face training days were conducted with selected library staff (digital mentors) covering digital literacy skills, dementia education including specific learning methods to support the uptake of digital skills for the person living with dementia (PLWD).

Digital mentors were matched with participants. 3) A rolling enrollment supported by local dementia NGO allowed the tools and learning methods to be refined during the early stages of the project. Weekly online feedback meetings were held with digital mentors, digital lead at library and UoA researchers. The digital mentoring process was completed within six weeks. This process involved twice weekly meetings with between the PLWD and their designated, digital mentor, zoom contact was also encouraged. Overall, all participants showed improved levels of digital literacy at completion of the project with five of the group completing an online 6 week twice a week cognitive stimulation training program.

No we have completed all objectives of the project. However, we would be keen to continue to work in other library centres around Aotearoa to disseminate this mahi.

What are the outcomes of this project? *

This project established that library staff (digital mentors) could educate and train People living with dementia to use a digital device with a combined learning method of errorless learning and spatial retrieval. Outcomes showed participants had improved digital confidence and skills over the 6 weeks and improved quality of life and cognition. (see attached Final Report)

Who have you worked with to make this project happen?

This has been a collaborative project with Rotorua Library, Dementia Lakes and University of Auckland personal.

For example, staff, volunteers, other organisations or support that has been instrumental in this mahi.

Describe any changes from the original proposal and the reason the changes were required.

The proposed project did not change however the recruitment engagement and retention of the participants i.e., people living with dementia activities was affected during the entire period of recruitment and intervention due to the Pandemic. This also had a major impact on how the digital mentors were able to be trained and conduct their mahi in the project. It was a continuing start/stop project as the government-imposed regulations.

We may use this information to help inform others undertaking similar work.

What did you or your team/organisation learn as a result of doing this project? *

Working collaboratively with a focus on co-design was seen as a key success of the project. The technological mode of educational delivery used in this project were more effective than the more traditional education generally provided in the digital literacy space. The importance of knowledge sharing regarding how older people with dementia can learn and the ability to problem solve to support the learning and delivery of the program that met individual needs.

We did reach the audience intended including both Māori and non-Māori people living with dementia however, the overall numbers that we projected to recruit were restricted by the pandemic, care partners not willing to enable their PLWD to participate, stating too busy, too tired, etc. Extending the project to other regions may have been helpful but not possible for logistical reasons; travel for digital mentors was restricted by Rotorua library boundaries. What has the feedback been to date? *

The project has received positive feedback from all those who participated in the project. Interested has been created during conference presentations. Rotorua Library Adult Lead Librarian and Dr Kathy Peri have a conference paper accepted at the 2023 National Library conference in November, we anticipate an opportunity to support this mahi with other libraries.
