Bridging the Digital Divide

Provide a short summary of the work that was completed as part of this project / research. *

Adult Beginner Computer Class

We developed a partnership with ELearning Porirua who provided the tutors, a volunteer and devices for participants.

We created a poster to advertise and advertised through our community connections. We circulated this widely within the community, we had a hard copy poster which we put up at local community centres, library and in social housing complexes and bus stops. We also had an advertisement in the local community panui. We found that hard copy advertising was more successful than online advertising.

For term 2 we had 22 registration and 13 graduated. In term 3 we had 24 registrations and 15 graduated.

With the support of Standard of Proof we developed two participant surveys one at the beginning to ascertain access to the internet, skill levels and what they are hoping to learn and an evaluation form for participants who completed. The initial form was a hard copy and the evaluation form we offered through google forms and hard copy..

We started our first course on 5 May (term 2) for 9 weeks. We started our second course on 12 August and had one class before level 4 lock down. We resumed on 23rd September as we had tried to resume immediately after lock down however participants were nervous about the new level 2 restriction and many said they would not attend. So we gave the participants time to get used to the new restrictions and resumed two weeks later with good participation. For the second course we shortened the number of classes to 7 weeks.

Youth Computer Course

We partnered with Te Puna Ora o ngā matamoe - a newly established computer/robotic s centre at Scots College. Scots College provide tutors and hardware including robotics. Our Māori and Pasifika students increased their coding skills and robotics. We started with 6 students and within 3 weeks had doubled in size. The young people were excited to be learning in a fun and creative environment. Due to COVID we lost momentum for term 3 and did not continue with the partnership.

Adult class

Our assumption that there are a number of vulnerable people in our community who do not have access to the internet or devices at home was confirmed. We also found that a large percentage of our participants were older people 50+ who had extremely limited digital experience and knowledge.

- Increasing digital skills and confidence for 28 local people.
- Distributed 28 desk top computers

Youth Computer course

12 Māori and Pasifika youth increased their coding and robotics experience. They increased their self confidence in the digital space and encouraged their friends to come along.

Skinny Jump

Connected 55 local families with affordable and accessible internet through Skinny Jump. Describe major achievements or outcomes of the project in terms of benefits for participants and/or others.

course in the local panui and offered his services as a volunteers and Te Puna Ora O Ngā Matamoe.

Describe any changes from the original proposal and the reason the changes were required.

The only change we made to the original proposal was that we partnered with Te Puna Ora o Ngā Matamoe rather than setting up our own youth computer hub and as a consequence did not purchase hardware. We also shortened the adult class from 9 weeks to 7 weeks to keep it focussed and did not include the week on coding and CV writing as it was not relevant to our audience . We also have a lower number of youth participating in our Youth Connecting Seniors programme and have one consistent young person and one adult who has focussed on the Skinny Jump component of the programme.

We may use this information to help inform others undertaking similar work.

What did you or your team/organisation learn as a result of doing this project? *

Advertising on local billboards and through community connections has been most successful. We have a wider range of ages and ethnicities in our adult course. We found that the average age of participants was higher than we had anticipated and their level of digital knowledge and competence was extremely low.

In the first term we found that the skill level was very broad and amended our advertising for the second term to identify this as a beginners course and more of the participants were older and had a more basic level of knowledge.

We will use the lesson and feedback for future funding proposals. We have also shared our learning with Smart Newtown and shared the outline of our classes. We will also share our learning within the wider Te Ora Hou network.
