Adult Beginner Computer Class

We have developed a partnership with ELearning Porirua who are providing the tutors and devices for participants.

We created a poster to advertise and advertised through our community connections. We have received 23 registrations from people in the community. Of these we have had two people withdraw (one due to family commitments and one who decided he did not need to learn these skills.

We have (with support from Standard of Proof) a short survey to determine access to the internet, skill levels and what they are hoping to learn. This provided very useful information for our tutor.

We started our course on 5 May (term 2) and will run a second course in term 3.

Youth Computer Course

We are partnering with Te Puna Ora o ngā matamoe - a newly established computer/robotics centre at Scots College. Scots College provide tutors and hardware including robotics. Our Māori and Pasifika students are increasing their coding skills and learning robotics.

We started with 6 students and in three weeks has doubled in size. The young people are

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excited to be learning in a fun and creative environment.

Skinny Jump Modems

We continue to connect local people with affordable internet access and since February have signed up 26 people and so are on track for target of 50

What are the outcomes of this project so far? *

We are still in the early stages of the project as we only started at the beginning of May. However we are pleased with progress and the uptake of the computer classes (adult and youth). Informal feedback has been positive. We have a member of the community who approached us as he saw the advertising for the computer course and wants to volunteer to share his knowledge and skills with the adult computer class.

Describe major achievements of the project so far in terms of benefits for participants and/or others.

What have you learnt so far? *

Advertising on local billboards and through community connections has been most successful. We have a wider range of ages and ethnicities in our adult course. We will include ethnicity in the next survey.

We are working to break down the barriers to participation, including transport for local residents and allowing children to come along. We provide a light supper for all participants ,(adults and youth) which the first week many were pleasantly surprised by the provision of kai.

It is still early days and we have not had to change anything in our approach so far, but will talk to participants and amend as required. In the future we may look at being more proactive with recruitment of volunteers to assist the tutor and participants if uptake is so high next term.
