Online Abuse of PM Jacinda Ardern and President Tsai Ing-wen

Provide a short summary of the work that was completed as part of this initiative.

This project was initially conceived as part of a large, multi-year academic study on online news media and social media treatment/mistreatment of former NZ Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern and Taiwan's President Tsai Ing-wen, mostly during the Covid-19 pandemic.

The purpose of this study was to comparatively examine the role of online media in gendered leadership and pandemic response, with a focus on potential fake news, disinformation, and hate speech targeting the female head of the state in Aotearoa and Taiwan, respectively.

Along with the progression of the study and building on our earlier collections of domestic online news articles respectively from NZ and Taiwan, we have decided to focus this part of the project on international online news media to develop a broader and more complete understanding of how Ardern and Tsai have been treated and portrayed in online news, so as to add an international dimension to our collections of domestic online news reports. Meanwhile, social media will be investigated during the next stage of this study in future. This change was approved by InternetNZ.

The funding from InternetNZ was used to hire two part-time Research Assistants (RAs) with relevant cultural/linguistic knowledge and postgraduate-level research skills in relevant fields to collect online news articles that cover Ardern and Tsai from international news outlets, starting from the United States and extending to the United Kingdom, given the large number of news media in these countries.

The two RAs collected the data using several online newspaper databases provided by the University, plus individual news websites, to cover major online news outlets from the selected countries. They also manually reviewed and selected relevant news articles to exclude short, routine news updates and focus instead on those with sufficient discussions

The data collection was carried out on a part-time basis and completed by the two RAs from Nov 6 to Dec 15, 2023. Data coding and analysis will be carried out later by the Principal Investigator.

The two Research Assistants collected 150 international online news articles covering former PM Jacinda Ardern and 383 international online news articles covering Taiwan's President Tsai Ing-wen.

These sets of data have been added to our earlier collections of domestic online news articles from Aotearoa and Taiwan, which will be used for subsequent research and analysis.

The data were collected and stored using EndNote libraries, and the datasets are available upon request.
