A framework for digital platforms to ensure Data Sovereignty

We have formed a team comprising the principal applicant (Dr. Farhad Mehdipour), a Māori advisor (Dr. Karaitiana Taiuru), and a master's student currently working on his master thesis. Together, the team developed a research proposal titled 'Guidelines to Ensure Māori Data Sovereignty in the ICT Sector of New Zealand.' This proposal aligns with our funded project and underwent a thorough review, receiving approval from the reviewers committee at Otago Polytechnic - Auckland International Campus (OPAIC).

Following a structured survey approach with a questionnaire as the primary data collection tool, an ethics application was submitted and approved by the OPAIC Ethics Committee last November.

Currently, we are actively engaged in the data collection and analysis phase, with an anticipated completion date by the end of March 2024. Additionally, we have submitted an article to the Smart Sustainable Development 2024 conference (<https://www.smartsust.org>), scheduled for February 14, and the paper has been accepted for publication in Frontiers in Sustainability (<https://www.frontiersin.org/journals/sustainability>). Additionally, Dr. Aniket Mahanti from the University of Auckland made contributions to both the writing and review of the paper."

Looking ahead, we plan to submit a journal paper and present the final research outcomes at a research forum in March or April.

Are there any areas where you need further funding or support to complete this initiative?

The research proposal stemming from this project required extensive literature review and underwent thorough review by multiple experts, requiring several updates before receiving approval from the review committee at Otago Polytechnic - Auckland International Campus (OPAIC). The research scope has been expanded to effectively address the primary objectives of the project.

The survey included approximately 100 participants, incorporating experts from the ICT sector. A thorough analysis of both the data collected from participants and the insights gained from secondary sources demands careful consideration and time. We project to yield preliminary results by the end of March 2024. However, securing additional support for six months or, potentially, one year would extend the project timeline, affording us the opportunity to refine our findings. This extended timeframe would facilitate the thorough preparation of a comprehensive journal paper, enabling us to present our work with more substantial outcomes at both national and international venues.

What are the outcomes of this initiative? *

The primary outcome of this project will be a set of guidelines and recommendations serving as a prescriptive framework for the ICT sector to operate digital platforms that ensure Māori Data Sovereignty within the New Zealand context. The project's primary beneficiaries are Iwi, hapū, Māori, whānau, and Māori groups and it can contribute to increasing awareness and further development of Māori cultural values.
