What were the highlights and main takeaways of this conference?

The main highlight of the conference was definitely the discussion following my presentation. It was insightful to get opinions and thoughts from people who deal with the day to day challenges of the food industry. My presentation seemed to spur discussion, perhaps due to the fact I focused on real-life applications and the q-methodology approach I took inherently requires an understanding of the current sentiment and feelings of the industry.

A main takeaway from the conference was that the understanding of blockchain technology is lower than I thought, even at a information systems conference. Another takeaway was that I found the majority of other presentations to be incredibly academia focused rather than providing real-life value and solving issues that are real and important. This gap seems to be caused by the need to work within an industry to gain a true understanding of the inner workings such as politics, hierarchy and anything else that can't really be gauged from outside. A lot of the research completed and presented at the conference seemed more aimed at meeting academic check points and getting a good mark rather than being of actual use. This might sound harsh, but it is just my opinion, and I feel my paper was still guilty of the same thing.

How to solve this is another question, if I had to do my project again, I would definitely spend more time having quality discussions with industry experts and be assertive and demanding of their time. Overall I definitely think there were plenty of interesting research projects being presented at the conference, however, my over-arching takeaway was I felt I was sitting through an academic presentation at university more so than a business environment focusing on improvements and advancements. This was my first conference like this so perhaps I was expecting the wrong thing and I could be totally wrong in my view of things, however, in the spirit of full honesty I've explained it as best I can.

What were the lowlights of the conference?

The lowlights were in line with what I have already mentioned, a lot of dry and data-based presentations with slides full of tables of data and graphs. It seems that most of these types of presentations were by younger presenters who have gone straight from undergrad to postgrad and are simply following directions given by their educational body. I think the true purpose and point of the research is therefore slightly lost as they are following a template
