### **Project title \***

DIGIFALE - an intergenerational approach to improving digital inclusion

### **Provide a short summary of the work that was completed as part of this project / research. \***

We completed the literature search which later was turned into a clearinghouse rather than a literature report. We interviewed 12 Niue mamatua (older adults) who received a mobile phone during 2020. All interviews were conducted over the phone due to COVID-19 lockdown restrictions. A publication of the findings and methodology used has been submitted to AlterNative: An International Journal of Indigenous Peoples. The findings of this project will also be used to present at the 2022 HiNZ conference (March 22&23) which Amio Matenga Ikihele is a speaker and panellist.

**What are the outcomes of this project? \***

1. Literature review / scoping: IThe results of the literature search undertaken by Amio Matenga Ikihele was used to create a clearinghouse with literature, reports, news articles, websites, webinars, blogs and stories related to digital inclusion, digital equity, digital literacy, digital divide, digital exclusion and Pacific communities placed on our website [www.digifale.co.nz](http://www.digifale.co.nz)
2. Develop research tools: Research tools were developed and translated into Vagahau Niue.
3. Obtaining ethics approval for study: Ethics approval was granted by the University of Auckland Ethics Committee.
4. Data collection: Interviews with Niue mamatua were held in September and October 2021. All interviews were facilitated by Amio in both English and Vagahau Niue.
5. Data analysis: Analysis was undertaken by Amio. The themes generated were reviewed by staff at Moana Research and The University of Auckland.
6. Report: A publication has been submitted to AlterNative: An International Journal of Indigenous Peoples.
7. Presentation to families: A suitable date and time is yet to be finalised with families since we are on the Red light traffic light system.

- The findings from the literature search was instead used to create a clearinghouse rather than a report outlining the findings. This was the only pivot that was made from the original proposal.

We may use this information to help inform others undertaking similar work.

**What did you or your team/organisation learn as a result of doing this project? \***

The importance of sharing positive stories of impact as opposed to a deficit lens. While the original scope stated a literature review was to be undertaken, we felt knowledge was best shared by having all literature placed under one 'fale' (house). We also did not want to reemphasise the deficit approach of Pacific communities continually being digitally disadvantaged. The research has also resulted in the submission of a high quality research paper in an international Indigenous journal which will contribute to the work of understanding the success factors, challenges and considerations for using mobile phones
