We have been able to provide essential resources to our ākonga to keep them engaged in their learning and focused on maintaining a positive mindset in these difficult times.

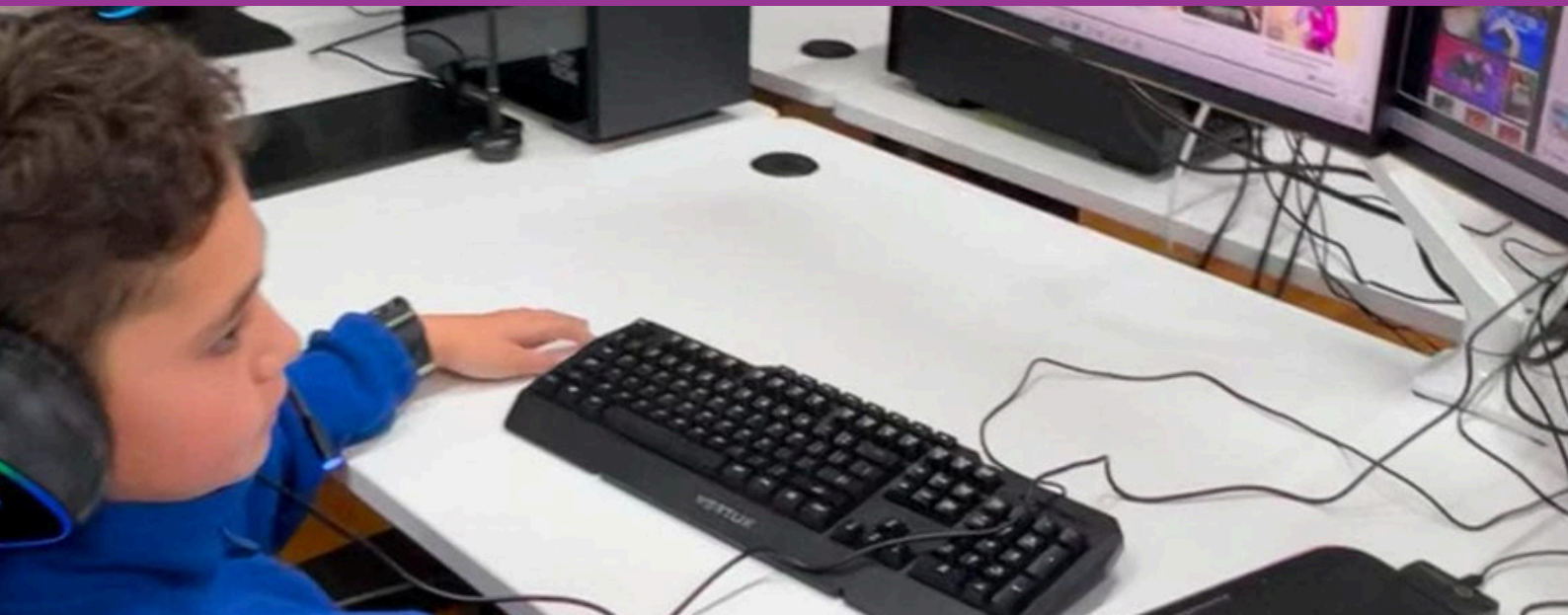
In addition, we are also reinforcing their learning through focused literacy and numeracy activities to ensure that ākonga develop a strong foundation.
