Provide a summary of the work undertaken. *

We started the project by engaging the Community Comms Collective to do a deep assessment of our existing website from a user experience perspective, especially with an accessibility lens. They pointed out a number of deficiencies, some we knew about, many we didn't. The navigation through the website was especially weak with feedback given that users couldn't intuitively get to where they wanted to go or where they expected to find something.

A full re-write of the existing website was undertaken using a Wordpress staging website over several months. Expert UX advice was solicited especially about site structure and ease of navigation. Extensive input and collaboration was undertaken with the multiple sclerosis community both before the project began, at project milestones and also towards the end of the project using Marker.IO for all people with MS who chose to, to give their feedback on what was working well for them and what could be improved.

We especially liaised with those less-abled due to their multiple sclerosis for what they wanted to see and what could help them and then implemented.

Firstly, this project has brought our MS community together. It was a great project that we all worked on together and had a fantastic outcome.

We have had overwhelmingly positive feedback from both people with MS and the wider community. The traffic to the website and the time spent browsing it are up by over 300% and 400% respectively in the last quarter compared to the same quarter in 2023.

Our MS Community Advisors have said they are so happy with the final result and they feel proud to direct those newly diagnosed with MS to the website.

We were especially touched by the feedback of some of our recent migrant families who are able to view the information about MS they require in their own language.

What did you learn during this project? *

Perhaps the most interesting learning was some feedback we received from someone with MS who is severely disabled and challenged to use IT. They told us that the end users who actually require advanced accessibility features to use computers or access the internet will already have them on their devices, either as a built-in feature or as an additional piece of software that the user needs to access not only the MS Auckland web page, but all of the Web and indeed all computer software.

This challenged our existing thinking and we wrestled with this for some time. Eventually we continued to use plugins that improved accessibility as our MS Community Advisors could use them as examples in their in house presentations and also having these so clearly visible on our website showed our organisation's deep 'commitment to accessibility'.
