


Participation Rate

2454 people were invited.

822 people completed the survey.

The participation rate is 33.5%.



Participation rates help us understand how representative the feedback is. While we are not aiming for 100%, a higher percentage indicates a representative sample.








Average Question Score by Category

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



This is a Yes – No question type. The scores are calculated by dividing the count of 'Yes' or 'No' answers by the total count of responses, then converting to a %






How much further time do you think people in the conflicts should be given to resolve who should register the domain name?




If a private auction between the parties in the conflict was held would you participate?


If you became entitled to register the conflicted domain name would you register it?








Please select all that apply regarding another person obtaining the shorter version of the domain name.








Please select all that apply to your conflicted domain name.








Please select the options that relate to your domain name in the conflict. (Tick all that apply.)

Please state any other suggestion for allocating the shorter domain name that you support.

• 433 free text responses, a large number were about the individual domain name holder's use of their domain name and experience of the conflicted names process.

Key observations

- 51 expressed support for awarding to the oldest domain name, and many others said that age of domain name should be a factor in who should have the domain name
- 11 expressed support for preferring .co.nz over others, and a further 8 mentioned that .co.nz was the primary domain
- 35 stressed that there should be no allocation without agreement, or until there was only one domain name left in the set
- 32 wrote about the benefits of an auction approach
- 39 thought priority should be given to those actively using the domain names (some disagree with domain name investors being in the set)
- 26 stressed that people who refused to respond to approaches to resolve should be eliminated
- 10 suggested adjudication, and a significant number gave diverse criteria to judge the merits of the domain names in set including being a registered company name, business, or New Zealand based
- 21 thought more could be achieved through mediation and dialogue
- 11 preferred that the names be permanently locked
- 10 referred to prioritising trademarks

Other free text comments.

- A few statements along these lines:
 - Favouring the person with the most equivalent domain names
 - Favouring businesses over clubs
 - Charging people to enter a draw as a fundraiser
 - Requiring a deposit is lodged to eliminate disinterested parties
 - This shouldn't be about the money but about the merits of how the domain names are being used
 - Continued blocking doesn't allow the space to evolve
 - A group could run a 'surname' domain name to provide email addresses to those families
 - A payment from one party to another will solve the issue
 - Difference of bargaining power means expecting agreement isn't 'fair'
 - The other holder is our competitor sitting on the domain name and it's impossible to negotiate
 - The domain name that aligns best with the brand of the user should be preferred
 - The worst result is to leave this in limbo and not end it
 - Some parties don't know how to contact each other or know how to work out who is in the conflict set with them
 - Individuals expressed strong 'ownership' towards a domain name that is a family or hapu name or a long-held business
 - Geographic names are considered by some as regionally important
 - Concern that the release of the shorter name would result in an increase in scams and confusion including emails arriving at the wrong place
